As a result, the number of clients we help every year varies. We provide legal and educational services, based upon the client's needs. Since our founding in 2007, we have received more than 15,100 inquiries.

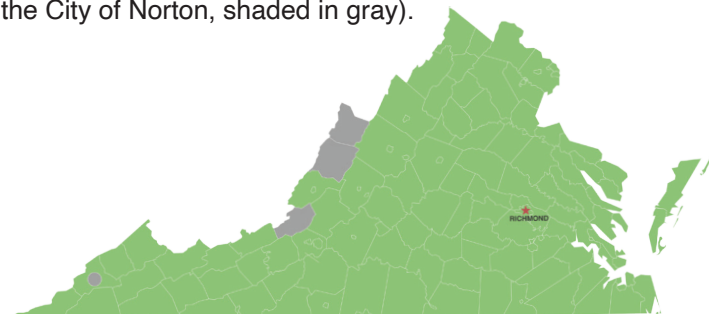

We have represented clients residing in **97%** of Virginia's localities (except for Bath, Craig, and Highland Counties and the City of Norton, shaded in gray).



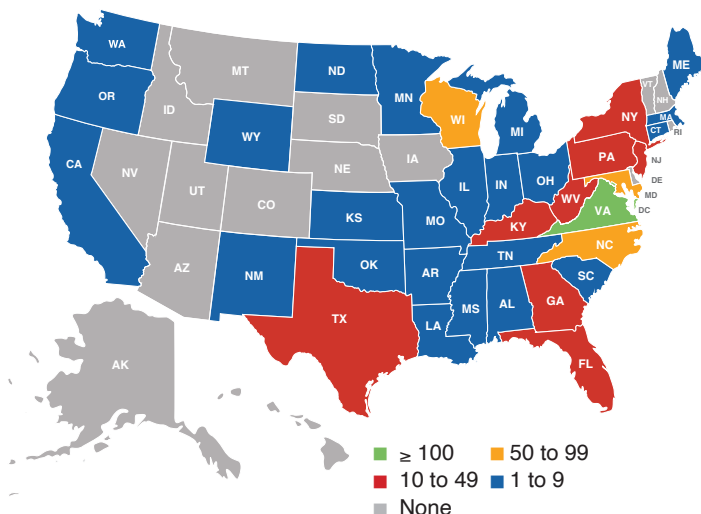

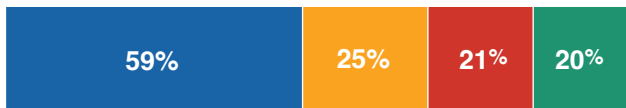

LEGISLATIVE IMPACTS

We're seeing positive changes from new state laws for our clients. The number of cases for driving on a suspended license this year dropped by more than half from last year, thanks to eliminating the suspension period of purged cases that were 10 or more years old. The new category of restricted license for those with motor vehicle-related civil judgments allows our clients to legally drive to work and keep a job.

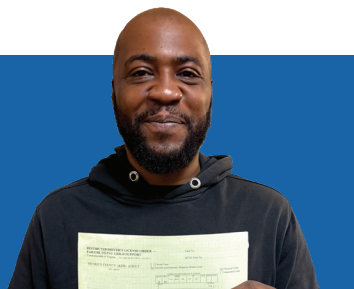

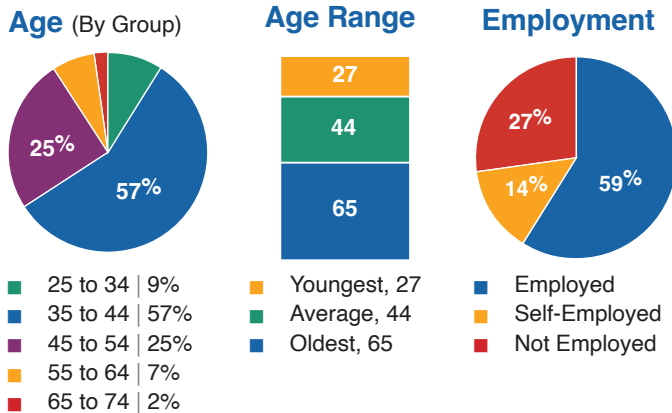
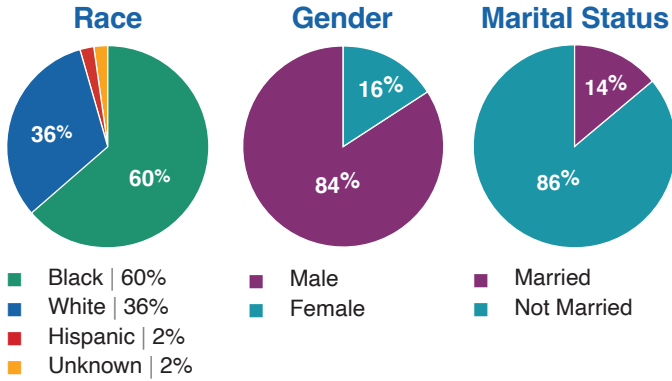

DTW Driving School offers classroom and online driver improvement clinics and an 8-hour Driver's Manual Refresher Course for persons failing the DMV written test three times.

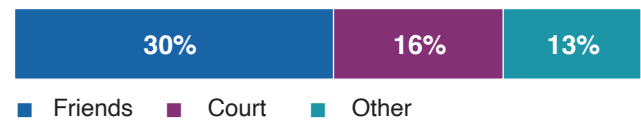


Two Blue Ridge Mile advocates and their adviser enjoyed W&L's graduation in May.

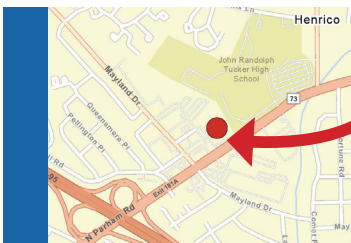
