We are excited to announce that this year's keynote speaker will be LaNay Harris of Chicago. At age 17, she was sentenced to 13 to 20 years in prison and thought her life was over. After the initial shock of prison life, she made a promise to herself to focus on education, positive self-talk, and self-love while still incarcerated. Today, Ms. Harris is a licensed builder, licensed broker, licensed insurance agent, author, business leader, and ordained minister.

Chadwick Dotson, director of the Virginia Department of Corrections, a retired judge, and a former chair of the Virginia Parole Board, also will deliver remarks.

During the luncheon, we will focus on clients who have regained their licenses as well as highlight our community partners. We are excited about this past year's achievements and what lies ahead for our organization.
